It will be on a first come first served basis and charged at £1 a mile. This will be trialled to check that this meets costs as it is intended to be not for profit.

## Responsible dog ownership and pink spray



Loggerheads Parish Council is trying to raise awareness of responsible dog ownership and care, especially concerning dog fouling on our footpaths and leisure areas.

You may notice that dog mess and abandoned plastic bags containing dog mess are being sprayed with pink chalk spray (which is bio-degradable).

This is to warn pedestrians to avoid it and shame owners.

If you walk your dog it is an offence not to clean up after them and soon you will be required, is asked, to show that you are carrying a bag with you to pick up their mess. If you are not a £100 fixed penalty or a fine up to £1,000 will apply. If they defecate on a pavement bag it and bin it. If they defecate in the woods either bag it and bin it or stick and flick into the undergrowth where it will naturally dissolve. Leaving it in a plastic bag on the ground or hanging on a tree it will not disappear. Remember "there is no such thing as a DOG POO Fairy" to clean up after you and your dog.

In the near future Council's will be able to take DNA samples and identify the dog who is fouling, this is already happening in some areas.

You can put your plastic bags in **any** waste bin and of course you can always take it home with you and place in your grey bin for the Council to remove.

We Brits are a nation of dog lovers. Please make sure all residents in the parish are happy to see dogs and their owners out enjoying Loggerheads.

NB It is not necessary to buy expensive dog poo bags Wilkinson's have 300 nappy bags for 35p, perfectly good for the purpose. Less than a £1.00 for a years' supply!!
