Two Defibrillators in Loggerheads

The crew at the new fire station in Loggerheads have been raising money to provide life-saving equipment in locations that are easily accessible to local residents. The Peel Arms pub in Ashley was the first to get a defibrillator some time ago.

March saw the launch of two new defibrillators in Loggerheads. One, located on the front of the community fire station, has been donated by the Parish Council. The other is in the Co-op, provided by money raised by the fire crew and donations from local residents. There is also one recently fitted at Slater's Country Inn. More fund raising is planned to buy another one for Knighton Village Hall.

So how do you get access to one? - If you ring 999 for a person with a suspected heart attack and live near one of these locations, the West Midlands Ambulance Service will direct you to collect the defibrillator and talk you through how to use it before medical assistance arrives. The fire crew are all trained in its use, as are staff at the Co-op and some volunteers in the community.
