## **Update:**

511 residents completed a questionnaire giving their views on the area. The Neighbourhood Plan Working Group have used this to identify the issues that you would like to see addressed and have prepared some draft aims that should be addressed over the next 10 years. Come along to the Hugo Meynell School on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> June at 7.30pm to hear a summary of the issues, the draft aims and what this means for the plan.

**Next steps:** The draft aims will be agreed, subject to resident's feedback and then converted into "planning policies" as required to comply with national planning guidance.



**Superfast fibre broadband** has arrived in the villages of Loggerheads, Ashley, Knighton and Mucklestone. Cabinets are now live in these areas and if you are within approximately 1.2 km radius of the cabinets you should benefit and be able to order a superfast fibre package with speeds of between 24Mbps and 80 Mbps. This depends on your distance from the cabinet you are connected to.

Even if you are over 1.2km away you should see some improvement in speeds. Residents check what speeds thev can get https://www.dslchecker.bt.com/. The key message is that this upgrade is not automatic; you need to contact your Internet Service Provider and place an order for a fibre service. Please note that the Burntwood Estate in Loggerheads is not connected yet. There is still some more work to do here. It is in the Superfast Staffordshire Project and will be live by the end of 2017. Superfast Staffordshire is building on the commercial rollout to bring superfast broadband to 95% of premises by 2017. For more information visit http://www.superfaststaffordshire.co.uk/
