

Proposed erection of new fencing at Ashley House

The Parish Council received a number of representations from residents objecting to a recent planning application submitted by the Huntercombe Group for new, more secure, fencing at Ashley House. It was recognised that whilst no formal representation could be made to the Borough Council on planning issues *per se*, there were major concerns arising from the application. The Parish Council has, accordingly, made a strongly worded comment to the Planning Department to the effect that the applicant did not, despite previous assurances, appear to acknowledge the impact of such proposals on Ashley residents. Local consultation procedures that villagers have a right to expect to be observed appear not to have been followed on this occasion. The Parish Council has also demanded that the Borough should apply a condition that, should the proposal be permitted, the applicant should give an undertaking that no subsequent application for a material change of use of the premises of a nature unlikely to be welcomed by residents will be sought. The Parish Council remains keen to engage with the management of Ashley House, and a programme of liaison meetings has recently resumed. It is hoped that constructive dialogue and open communication may allay the concerns of residents about actual and prospective developments at Ashley House.

GRITTING

As in previous years, the Parish Council will try to help ensure that local residents face the minimum inconvenience during the coming winter by bolstering the efforts of the County Council Highways Department in the provision of gritting services. The gritting routes identified below will be serviced, at times of severe weather, to complement the work done on major routes by the County Council.

Mucklestone: From Junction of B5415 to junction of B5026 at Mucklestone Church

Loggerheads: Hunters Point, St Margaret's Road, Badger Brow Road, Chestnut Road.

Ashley: Pinewood Road, Charnes Road, Sovereign Lane to Junction with Church Road. Doctor's Bank, School Lane to Junction with Church Road. Lower Road from The Dale to junction with B5026 Eccleshall Road.

A number of Parish Council-owned grit bins will again be placed and serviced at the following locations in the Parish, adding to those provided by the County:-

NEW COMMUNITY FIRE STATION – Planning application

The Parish Council responded comprehensively to the recent 'reserved matters' planning application submitted by Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent Fire & Rescue Service which added detail to the approved outline plans for the new Community Fire Station on Market Drayton Road, for which permission was granted earlier in the year.

It has been confirmed by the Borough Council that a number of traffic calming measures must be implemented on the A53 in the proximity of the site, including lights, 'dragon's teeth' highway markings, and anti-skid surfacing. The Parish Council has sought confirmation both from the applicant and the LPA that the traffic calming lights on the highway will include audible warnings in addition to the flashing lights themselves, together with appropriate signage.

A major concern remains that the visibility splay providing sightlines to the east (i.e. in the direction of the centre of Loggerheads) may prove inadequate. It is considered vital that the visibility splays relate not to the nominal speed limit of 30mph but rather to the much higher 85 percentile speed of traffic established in the analysis submitted by the developer in the original outline application. It has also been pointed out that neither the current surface water drainage system nor the foul sewer system are working efficiently with instances of flooding throughout the village and foul sewage overflowing into adjacent watercourses at times of heavy flows. Details have been asked for of how the developers intend to ensure that no additional surface run off from the site adds to the pressure on the existing, inadequate infrastructure.

NIGHT TIME STREET LIGHTING CONSULTATION

The Council has duly undertaken an analysis of the responses received to the questionnaire distributed in the August edition of the newsletter. Ultimately some sixty completed forms were received from residents. A majority (17 against 11) of those who answered the question "I would prefer to see no change at all to existing lighting arrangements" affirmed their opposition to change. With respect to the detailed questions about options should a change be implemented, no definitive collective opinion emerged. There was little support for a 'selective dimming approach', i.e. dimming of lights on the main thoroughfares and the 'part-night' option in areas of relatively dense housing. Detailed examination of those responses nominally in favour of the 'part-night' switch off revealed that the majority who would approve this course of action actually live in parts of the parish with little, if any, street lighting; conversely there is far less support for this idea amongst those who actually live in the relatively well illuminated areas.

Residents will wish to note that the County Council has, in any event, following a complete review of its long term Street Lighting PFI contract, reconfirmed the original approval of operational changes to modernise the way its street lighting service is to be delivered on the highway network. These changes will include the objective to introduce dimmable street lights on a County wide basis with the intention of conserving energy.

MORE DROPPED KERBS : IMPROVED ACCESSIBILITY

Following representations from the Parish Council, an investigation has been carried out, by the County Council Highways Department, into the inadequacy of kerb drops at various key locations in Loggerheads which impede access for wheelchair and mobility scooter users. Particular problems were evident at the Co-op car park on Eccleshall Road It is anticipated that related remedial works will be undertaken as a matter of priority.
